
OUT of REACH FACTS OVERVIEW

WAGES NEEDED TO AFFORD RENT ACROSS THE U.S.



IN 2019, THE 2-BEDROOM NATIONAL HOUSING WAGE IS

\$22.96

A full-time worker must earn at least \$22.96 an hour to afford a modest, two-bedroom apartment without spending more than 30% of income on rent. This wage varies from state to state.
